For the academic years from 2014/2015 until 2019/20

Grading system

There are two types of grading systems in use in Polish Higher Education Institutions. The first one, called *General grading system*, consists of two possible grades: **Pass** (*zal*) and **Fail** (*nzal*). The second one, called *Specific grading system* consist of six possible grades. The grade is obtained by the student, depending on the achievements, based on total completion of all requirements laid down by the teacher. Typical distribution table was shown below:

Table 1. Grade awarded based on students achievements

% of requirements completed by the student	Awarded grade	Description
≤ 50%	2,0	Fail
> 60%	3,0	Pass, sufficient
> 70%	3,5	Satisfactory
> 70%	4,0	Good
> 80%	4,5	Very good
> 90%	5,0	Excellent

In the following document, only the *Specific Grading System* will be described, as it has direct statistical impact on credit transfer and recognition.

Grade distribution

Current grade distribution table was updated by the end of the **academic year 2019/2020**, in the perspective of the last 5 years. Total number of grades awarded (*Specific grading system* only) was equal to **129 339** (including **123 259** passing grades). The grading table was given below:

In purpose to allow easier credit transfer for our Erasmus+ partner institutions, grade distribution (cumulative) was shown below:

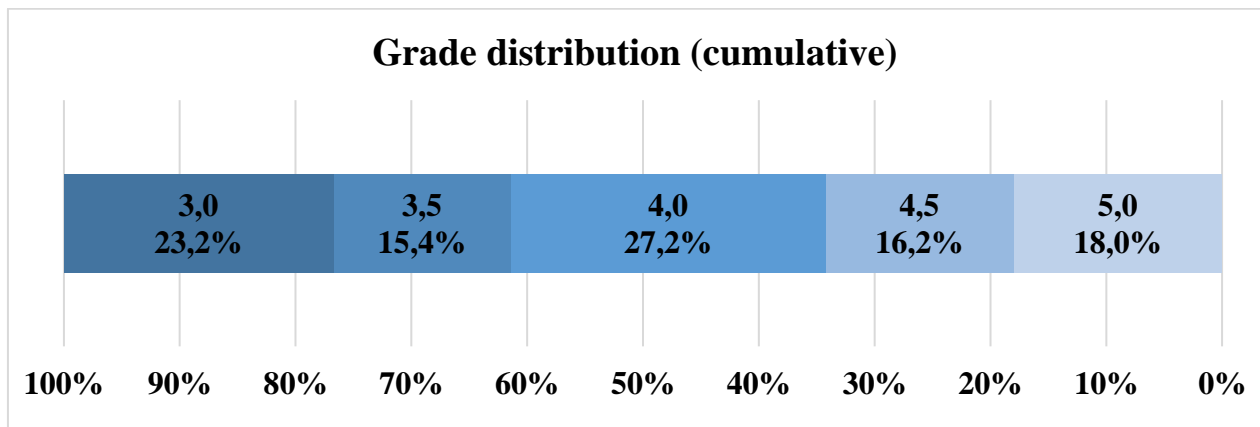


Fig. 1. Grade distribution (cumulative)
